By considering all the current situation of the company and declining market share board of director of the company decided to delist the company form the Dhaka Stock Exchange and operate as public limited company. On behalf of the board I would also like to inform you that the Directors of the company has submitted their exit plan as per Securities Laws. Under the exit plan, you may continue your existing shareholding relationship with the company or you may harvest your investment under exit plan of the company.

My sincere thanks to all the respectable Shareholders for extending their continuous support and confidence in the Board of Directors of your Company. I also like to put on record my sincere appreciation & thanks to the Bangladesh Securities And Exchange Commission, Banks, Auditors, Suppliers, Customers and Staff of the company for their support and appreciation.

Directors' Report (2021-2022)

Industry outlook:

Bangladesh has good economic prospect over the last few years and it shall be continued upcoming years. However, despite the fact of good economic condition of Bangladesh, the refractories business experiencing negative growth in last few years. The refractories market itself very small. Moreover, the cheap supply from overseas, e.g. China, India, was stiff the completion more.

The completion of refractories business in Bangladesh was further intensify due to shortage of materials, frequent failure of power supply, e.g. gas, electricity, and fallen demand in local market. Considering the fact, the company is

Segment-wise or product-wise performance:

The company is operating on single reportable segment. There has no operating segment within the company. As such, there is no scope for segment-wise or Product wise performance reporting.

The Board of Directors recognises that Risk is an integrated part of our operating environment. No undertaking is free from risks and concerns that might arise both from internal as well as external factors. The matter was also true for SRL. The management always take initiative to train/inform about the internal and external risk factors, mitigation plan and responsibilities of employees. Details of risk external and internal risk are given below:

The main risk and concern matter is that shortage of materials, frequent failure of power supply, e.g. gas, electricity, and fallen demand in local market. Over which, the company has no control or very limited control

Credit risk:

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will fail to discharge an obligation and cause the other party to incur a financial loss, without taking into account the fair value of any collateral. Concentration of credit risk arises when a number of counter parties are engaged in similar business activities or have similar economic features that would cause their ability to meet contractual obligations to be similarly affected by changes in economic, political or other conditions. Concentrations of credit risk indicate the relative sensitivity of the Company's performance to developments affecting a particular industry. The company has only allowed credit facility to customer who has good credit rating and good past track record and hence minimise the credit risk.

Market risk is the risk that changes in market prices, such as foreign exchange rates, interest rates and equity prices will affect the Company's income or the value of its holdings of financial instruments. The objective of market risk management is to manage and control market risk exposures within acceptable parameters while optimizing returns. Normally, the company does not hold any security that expose the market risk.

Liquidity risk:

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Company will encounter difficulty in meeting obligations associated with financial liabilities that are settled by delivering cash or another financial asset. This arises because of the possibility that the Company could be required to pay its liabilities earlier than expected or would have difficulty in raising funds to meet commitments associated with financial liabilities as they fall due. The Company's approach to managing liquidity is to ensure, as far as possible, that it will always have sufficient liquidity to meet its liabilities when due, under both normal and stressed conditions, without incurring unacceptable losses or risking damage to the Company's reputation. The Company manages liquidity risk by maintaining sufficient cash and bank balances according to the treasury plan and availability of financing through banking arrangements like overdraft facility.

Price risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of the company interrupted because of changes in market prices (other than those arising from interest rate risk or currency risk), market competition, shortage of row materials also increase the risk. Normally, the company does not hold any security that expose the market risk

Interest rate risk:

Interest rate risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market interest rates. Majority of the interest rate risk arises from short-term borrowings from financial institutions. The interest rate is capped at 9% by Bangladesh Bank. As such, the interest rate risk may not normally effect materially.

Currency risk:

Currency risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in foreign exchange rates. Currency risk arises mainly where receivables and payables exist due to transactions entered in foreign currencies. The Company is exposed to foreign currency risk only imported purchases, which are entered in a currency other than BDT. The company is closely monitor the currency rate and try to keep the currency risk low as much as possible.

Political risk:

Political risk. Political risk refers to the risk that an entity's returns could suffer as a result of political unrest, sudden change of government, changes in governance procedure. However, the political is extremely difficult to quantify or control.

Risk management:

The Board of Directors has overall responsibility for the establishment and oversight of the Company's risk management. The responsibility also includes developing and monitoring the Company's risk management policies. To assist the Board in discharging its oversight responsibility, management has been made responsible for identifying, monitoring and managing the Company's risk exposures.

Cost of Goods Sold:

This year's cost of goods sold was BDT 3,37,43,111as compared to last year's cost of goods sold of BDT 3,17,08,493. This is due to slightly increased in gross turnover, and the shortage of raw materials has been increased by 6.42%.

Gross Profit:

The company has achieved turnover of Tk. 3,99,87,964 during the year ended 30th June 2021. Last year's turnover was Tk.3,97,28,395. The turnover is increased by 0.65% over the last year. Gross profit earned during the year was Tk. 62,44,853 as against last year's gross profit of Tk. 80,19,902. This is due to slightly increased in gross turnover.

Net Profit/(Loss):

Net loss after tax during the year was decreased to Tk. (1,30,50,339) as compared to last year's Net loss after tax of Tk.(12,84,447)due to mainly impairment loss and increase of cost of goods sold.

Extra-Ordinary gain or loss:

During the year, there was no realized extra-ordinary gain or loss made by the company.

Related party transactions:

The related party transactions of the company are consisted of remuneration and loan of/from directors. During the year, company has carry out some related party transactions, mentioned in note no. 27 of audited financial statements, in normal course of business with the related parties under the same terms and conditions as applicable third party. Please see the details of related party transactions in note no. 27 of the audited financial statements.

Utilization of proceeds from public issues and/ or rights issues:

There was no public issue and/ or right issue offered during the year.

Financial results after the company goes for Initial Public Offering (IPO), Repeat Public Offering (RPO), Rights Offer, Direct Listing, etc.:

Initial Public Offering was made in the year 1988. Since then the company is performing well and making profit and paying out dividend accordingly. However, due to shortage of raw material, frequent failure of power supply, e.g. gas, electricity, and fallen demand in local market, the company unable to make profit in recent past.

Preparation of the financial statements of the company:

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard (IAS)/International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as adopted by Institute of Chartered Accountants of Bangladesh (ICAB), the Bangladesh Securities and Exchanges Rules 1987, the Companies Act 1994 and other applicable laws & regulation, assuming that the company is going concern.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with IASs/IFRSs that requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amount of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgments about the carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources.

Maintenance of Books and records:

The company is adequately maintaining the accounting records for all purchase, sales, income, expenses, cash receipt and payments in respect of ledger, vouchers, supporting evidence and maintenance of required register e.g. fixed asset, share register and others as required by law and regulations.

Accounting policies adopted by the company in preparation financial statements and accounting records:

The company follows International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) and International Accounting Standards (IAS) and compliance with the Bangladesh Securities and Exchanges Commission Rules 1987, the Companies Act, 1994 and other applicable rules and regulations. Detail description of accounting policies and estimation used for preparation of the financial statements of the company. The financial statements of the company are adequately described the accounting policy so that the reader of the financial statements is in good position to understand the accounting treatment and its presentation to the financial statements. Any changes of those accounting policies, if any, are adequately described in the concerned financial statements.

IASs/IFRSs are being following in preparation of the financial statements:

The company is consistently following IASs/IFRSs in preparation of the financial statements and compliance with the Bangladesh Securities and Exchanges Commission Rules 1987, the Companies Act, 1994 and other applicable

Systems of internal control:

The company has robust system of internal control to manage risk to a reasonable level of failure to achieve expected results and strategic objectives of the company. Statutory Auditors' Qualified Opinion 1:

The company did not call AGM since calendar year 2018. As such, both the company's financial statements were not approved by shareholders through ordinary resolution, and auditor's appointment for the year June 30, 2018, June 30, 2019, June 30, 2020, June 30, 2021 and June 30, 2022 was not also confirmed by the company's shareholders. However, the board of directors has given their consent to approve the financial statements for the year June 30, 2017, June 30, 2018, June 30, 2019, June 30, 2020, June 30, 2021 and June 30, 2022 in the company's board meeting. The board of directors have filled up the casual vacancy of statutory auditors by appointing current auditors for the financial year 2018-2022 in the board meeting even though the current auditors has completed his period as a statutory auditor as of June 30, 2017. The Securities Law and DSE listing regulation, 2015 requires to changes the statutory auditor after exceeding consecutive three years.

Management Response: Due to financial crisis and subsequent COVID-19 effect, the company, unable to held AGM for the financial year June 30, 2022. But the company has to complete the audited financial statements for regularity purpose eg. BSEC, DSE and NBR for tax assessment. As such, the board of director has appointed statutory auditor. Based on the director application, the honourable High Court Division of Supreme Court has accepted our application for holding AGM of concern year and directors has decided to hold AGM at February 18,

Statutory Auditors' Qualified Opinion 2:

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared assuming that the company will continue as going concern. The company has been suffering from running operation losses & subsequent net loss since 2013-14 recurring losses from operations poor current ratio (stood 0.45) and deficiency of production capacity by 40.13 % that raise significant doubt about its ability to continue as going concern.

Management Response: operation loss are incurring due to underutilization of production capacity of the company, fallen down of sales order as the demand of the company's product has been fallen down for various reason e.g. international competition, local demand fallen.

Statutory Auditors' Qualified Opinion 3:

As per labor act 2006, sec-234, the company must have to pay WPPF liability within 09 months form the accounting year end. The company is carrying forward WPPF liability of taka 729,503 at the year.

Management Response: Due to financial difficulty, the company unable to pay the WPPF. However, the management is considering for paying out these liabilities.

Statutory Auditors' Qualified Opinion 4:

According to the labor act 2006, company should maintain separate recognized provident fund under the trustee board, but no such fund was created by the management. This is non compile with the guidelines of labor act 2006.

Management Response: Though the company is facing financial difficulties management believe it is not feasible to maintain separate fund under the trustee board.

Compliance with the Code of Corporate Governance issued by BSEC:

The company is very keen to comply all the requirement. Based on our limited capability, we have complied with as much as possible the requirement of BSEC Code of Corporate Governance as applicable for the company, our compliance status and auditors' report on compliance status shown as Annexure C and Annexure B of these Annual Report.

In all the years described above, the company is made net loss. This is mostly due to non-achieving sufficient sales revenue. The company had just able to utilize the production capacity from 45% to 60%. As a result, the company unable to achieve sufficient gross profit to absorb the non-production overhead and financial expenses for the concerned year. The underutilization of production capacity was vary from 40% to 55%. This is mainly due to frequent power failure, shortage of skilled labour, other input and other various reasons.

Financial and Economic Scenario of Bangladesh and the Globe (In brief):

Bangladesh continues to be a country with strong macroeconomic fundamentals reflected in GDP growth in excess of 7 25% in 2021-22. The per capita national income reached USD 2,824 in FY2021-22 from USD 2,227a year earlier. The average inflation rate stood at 8.37 percent with moderate food inflation.

The economic slowdown is likely to intensify in 2022 with the Covid-19 pandemic and the latest Russia - Ukraine war now having a significant economic impact on it.

Risks and Concerns issues related to the financial statements:

The company design and implement a robust system of internal control to ensure that truthiness and financial reporting on timely basis. The board of directors is ultimate responsible for such internal control and truthiness and fairness of the financial reporting so that the reader can get message form the company in all respect including financial and nonfinancial on timely basis

Future plan or projection or forecast

The refractories industry in Bangladesh is reached maturate and it is very niche market. The competition of refractories business in Bangladesh was further intensify due to shortsge of materials, frequent failure of power supply, e.g. gas, electricity, and cheap supply from abroad especially India and china. Due to technology changes the company lost competiveness. To cope with technology changes, the company needs to huge investment in terms machine, land, manpower and others, which may not be, in our study, worthwhile due to cheap sources supply from India and China. As such, the industry may not able to return into profitability in near future.

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Savar Refractories Ltd. which comprise the financial position as at June 30, 2022, the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income, Statement of Changes in Equity and Statement of Cash Flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information

In our opinion, except the effect described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects,ofthe financial position ofthe Company as at June 30, 2022, and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs), the company act 1994, the Security and Exchange Rules 1987 and other applicable law and regulations.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

- The company did not call AGM since calendar year 2018. As such, both the company's financial statements were not approved by shareholders through ordinary resolution, andauditor's appointment for the yearJune 30, 2018, June 30, 2019, June 30, 2020, June 30, 2021and June 30, 2022 was not also confirmed by the company's shareholders. However, the board of directors has given their consent to approve the financial statements for the year June 30, 2017, June 30, 2018, June 30, 2019, June 30, 2020, June 30, 2021 and June 30, 2022 in the company's board meeting. The board of directors have filled up the casual vacancy of statutory auditors by appointing current auditors for the financial year 2018-2022 in the board meeting even though the current auditors has completed his period as a statutory auditor as of June 30, 2017. The Securities Law and DSE listing regulation, 2015 requires to changes the statutory auditor after exceeding consecutive three years.
- 2. The accompanying financial statements have been prepared assuming that the company will continue as going concern. The company has been suffering from running operation losses & subsequent net loss since 2013-14 recurring losses from operations poor current ratio (stood 0.45) and deficiency of production capacity by 40.13% that raise significant doubt about its ability to continue as going concern.
- 3. As per labor act 2006, sec-234, the company must have to pay WPPF liability within 09 months form the accounting year end. The company is carrying forward WPPF liability of taka 729,503 at the year.
- According to the labor act 2006, company should maintain separate recognized provident fund under the trustee board, but no such fund was created by the management. This is non compline with the guidelines of labor act 2006.

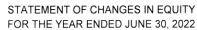

Notes to the Accounts For the year ended June 30, 2022



1. The Company and its Operation

1.01 Legal form of the Enterprise

The Savar Refractories Ltd. is incorporated in Bangladesh as a Public Limited Company as on 14 August 1982 and listed with Dhaka Stock Exchange Ltd. at May 1988 with an Authorized Capital of Tk. 25,000,000/- divided into 250,000 ordinary shares of Tk. 100/= each under the Companies Act 1994. Subsequently the company increased its share capital to Tk. 300,000,000/- divided into 30,000,000 ordinary shares of Tk. 10/=

1.02 Nature of Business activities

Savar Refractories Ltd. is primarily engaged to produce very high quality of Fire Bricks, Fire Clay, Castable & Insulation Bricks for 100% local consumption. The company can carry out legitimate business activity in line with business object statement in company's Article of Association.

1.03 Registered Address

The Registered Office of the Company is situated at 108 Airport Road, Tejgaon, Dhaka-1215 while the factory of the company is located at Mirzanagar (Nayarhat), Savar, Dhaka-1344.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

The accounts have been prepared according to integrated accounting principles adopted on a going concern basis under historical cost convention and are based on generally accepted accounting standard

2.01 Basis of Financial Statements preparation

The financial statements of the company have been prepared under historical cost convention in a going concern concept and on accrual basis in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and practice in Bangladesh. And the relevant Schedules applicable to the company of the Companies Act 1994 are consistently applied while preparing the financial statements for the year June 30, 2022.

2.02 Recognition of Property, Plant and Equipment

2.02.01 Property, Plant and Equipment are recognized, when and only when the necessary recognitions criteria set out in applicable accounting standards in Bangladesh are met, means it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the asset will flow to the Company and cost of the asset can be measured reliably. Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses.

Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset. The cost of self-constructed assets includes the cost of materials and direct labour, any other costs directly attributable to bringing the asset to a working condition for its intended use and the cost of dismantling and removing the items and restoring the site on which they are located if any.

Gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment are taken into account in face of Income Statement by comparing the proceeds from disposal with the carrying amount of property, plant and equipment. When revalued assets are sold, the relevant amount included in the revaluation reserve is transferred to retained earnings.



Depreciation is charged using reducing balance method. The following rate was used while calculating the depreciation.

2.03 Intangible Asset

Intangible assets are recognized in accordance with IAS 38 Intangible asset and depreciated using straight line method.

2.04 Current Assets

The company has recognized current assets when:

- It expects to realize the assets or intends to sell or consume it, in its normal operating cycle.
- It holds the asset primarily for the purpose of trading.
- It expects to realize asset within twelve months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current asset.

2.05 Inventory Valuation

Inventory is valued lower of cost and net selling price in accordance with IAS 2 Inventory. Cost of inventory is used to compute the value of inventory this year as cost value is lower than current market value.

2.06 Turnover and Sales Revenue

Turnover is shown net off return in ward, discount and VAT. Sales revenue is recognized as per IFRS 15 "Revenue from contracts with customers" on accrual basis as and when meets the recognition criteria of related accounting standard.

2.07 Lease

Changes to the company's accounting policies have been made as required, in accordance with the transitional provisions in the respective IFRS 16 Lease.

IFRS 16 supersedes IAS 17 *Leases*. The standard sets out the principles for the recognition, measurement, presentation and disclosure of leases and requires lessees to recognise most leases on the balance sheet.

The company adopted IFRS 16 using the modified retrospective method of adoption with the date of initial application of 1 July 2020. Under this method, the standard is applied retrospectively with the cumulative effect of initially applying the standard recognised at the date of initial application. The company elected to use the transition practical expedient to not reassess whether a contract is, or



contains a lease at 1 January 2020. Instead, the company applied the standard only to contracts that were previously identified as leases applying IAS 17 at the date of initial application.

The IFRS 16 requires to recognise the present value of minimum lease payment under the lease agreement as asset and Liability namely "Right to Use of Asset" and "Lease Liability" respectively. The Right to Use of Asset is added by the balance of advance payment at initial application of IFRS 16, which was July 01, 2020. However, IFRS 16 also allows the company to recognise the lease payment as expenses in respect of short term lease agreement. The company has just one lease arrangement which has fallen in second category. As such, lease (rental) payment was recognised as expenses in the Profit or Loss statement, when they incurred, for short term (temporary) lease and low value lease agreement.

2.08 Foreign Currencies Transactions

The functional and presentation currency is Bangladeshi Taka. And foreign currency transactions are converted into Bangladeshi TAKA at the exchange rate ruling on the date of transaction and the yearend balance are converted into Bangladeshi TAKA at the exchange rate ruling on the date of Balance Sheet as per IAS 21 "The effects of changes in Foreign Currency Rates".

2.09 Earnings Per Share (EPS)

Basic EPS

The Company presents basic earnings per share (EPS) data for its ordinary shares. Basic EPS is calculated by dividing the profit or loss attributable to ordinary shareholders of the Company by the weighted average number of ordinary shares outstanding during the period.

2.10 Taxation

The Company makes provision of current tax based on the taxable income as per the Income Tax Ordinance 1984. Taxable profits differs from profits as reported in the Statement of Comprehensive Income because it excludes items of income or expenses that are taxable or deductible in other year or are never taxable or deductible. Company's liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been enacted the balance sheet date.

2.11 Cash and Cash Equivalents

According to IAS 7 "Cash Flow statements", cash comprises cash in hand and demand deposits and cash equivalents are short term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in values. IAS 1 "Presentation of Financial Statements" provides those cash and cash equivalents is not restricted in use. Considering the provisions of IAS 7 and IAS 1, cash in hand and at bank balances have been considered as cash and bank balance.

2.12 Reporting currency

The figures in the financial statement represent Bangladeshi TAKA Currency, which have been rounded off to the nearest TAKA except where indicates otherwise.

2.13 Reporting Period

Financial Statement of the company covers one calendar year from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2022.

2.14 Comparative Information

Comparative information have been disclosed in respect of the year ended June 30, 2022 for all numerical information in the financial statements and also the narrative and descriptive information when it is relevant for understanding of the current year's financial statements.

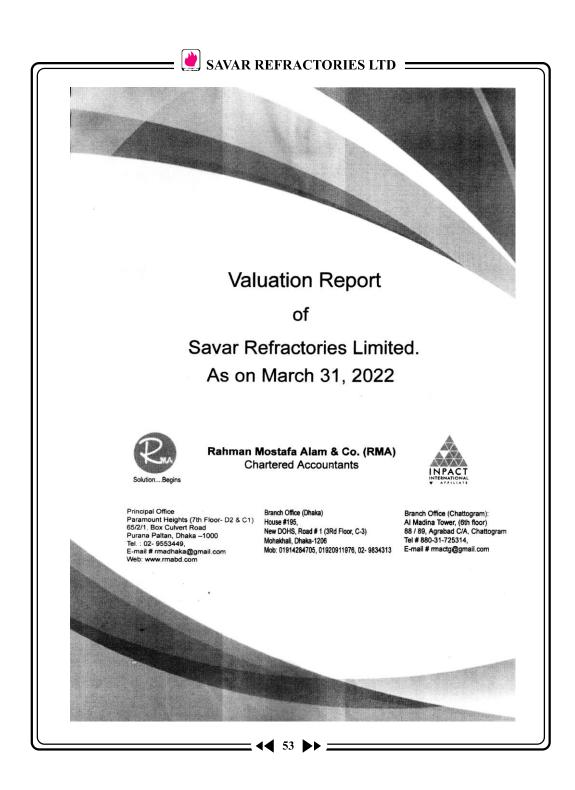




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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Savar Refractories Limited. (here-in-after referred to as "SRL") a public company with limited liability by shares was incorporated on 14th August 1982 vide Registration no-. $\frac{C-10169}{62}$ of 1982-1983 under companies act-1913. The company is listed in both Dhaka & Chittagong Stock Exchange Ltd. The corporate office is situated at 108 Airport Road, Tejgaon, Dhaka-1215. And Factory office is situated at Mirzanagar (Nayarhat), Savar, Dhaka.

The principal activities of the company are manufacturing high quality of Fire Bricks, Fire Clay, Castable & Insulation Brick for 100% local consumption. Savar Refractories Limited. appoints Rahman Mostafa Alam & Co. Chartered Accountants an external valuer to carry out an independent valuation of such assets. The purpose of the revaluation of assets is to arrive at a fair value of the company's assets as of March 31, 2022.

Rahman Mostafa Alam & Co. Chartered Accountants, (here-in-after referred to as "RMA") was engaged to carry out valuation exercise. After having appointment RMA formed a team which comprises 1 (one) Chartered Accountants, named Mr. Md. Anwaruzzaman FCA, 2 (Two) Professional staff of RMA Md. Kamrul Hasan & Towqir Ahmed, 2 (two) members of a surveyor named Raju Ahmed and Forhad Hossain from Mrida & Associates Ltd. along with representative of Savar Refractories Limited. Mr. Mojibur Rahman (Factory manager) and Mr. Tareque (Production Manager) complete the assignment. The team is headed by Mr. Md. Anwaruzzaman FCA.

In valuing assets we have considered the valuation of Land & Land Development, Factory building, Klin Construction, Plant & Machinery, Motor Vehicles, Furniture & Fixture, Equipment, Tundis Board

Revalued value of Land & Land Development is Tk. 162,000,000 as against the Carrying value of Tk. 10,739,494.

Revalued value of Factory building is Tk. 5,729,512 as against the Carrying value of Tk.7,090,091.

Revalued value of the Klin Construction is TK. 10,154,664 against the Carrying value of Tk. 16,657,489.

Revalued value of the Plant & Machinery is Tk. 8,515,659 against the Carrying value of Tk. 8,880,036.

Revalued value of the Motor Vehicles is TK. 459,236 which is not allowed as stipulated vide Notification no. SEC/CMRRCD/2009-193/150/Admin/dated August 18, 2013 issued by Bangladesh Securities and Exchange Commission (BSEC) against the Carrying value of Tk. 138,476. Instead, book value of the asset has been treated as present replacement cost.

Revalued value of the Furniture & Fixture is TK. 151,292 against the Carrying value of Tk. 567,570.





Revalued value of the Equipment is TK. 488,677 against the Carrying value of Tk. 1,703,979.

1.0 HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Savar Refractories Limited. (here-in-after referred to as "SRL") a public company with limited liability by shares was incorporated on 14th August 1982 vide Registration no-. $\frac{c-10169}{62}$ of 1982-1983 under companies act-1913. The company is listed in both Dhaka & Chittagong Stock Exchange Ltd. The corporate office is situated at 108 Airport Road, Tejgaon, Dhaka-1215. And Factory office is situated at Mirzanagar (Nayarhat), Savar, Dhaka. The principal activities of the company are manufacturing high quality of Fire Bricks, Fire Clay, Castable & Insulation Brick for 100% local consumption. Now the land area of the mills is 162 decimal.

2.00 PURPOSE OF VALUATION

The purpose of the valuation of assets is to arrive at a fair value of the company's assets (Land & Land Development, Factory building, Klin Construction, Plant & Machinery, Motor Vehicles, Furniture & Fixture, Equipment, Tundis Board.) as of March 31, 2022.

3.00 SCOPE OF WORK

To determine the valuation of assets of the company at fair value, the cut-off date has been fixed for March 31, 2022, Information, related documents, and certain explanations and clarifications were made available to us for the valuation.

Phase – 7 Review and valuation of Equipment

Phase - 8 Review and valuation of Tundis Board

Phase – 9. Carrying value of subject assets are taken from the Audited Financial Statements of SRL year ended on March 31, 2022, and subsequent addition up to cut off date has been considered in carrying value. We have taken this information as provided by the management with auditor's certificate without verification which is not within the scope of our valuation.





4.00 CUT OFF DATE

The valuation of assets of the company was carried out at the cut-off date of March 31, 2022

5.00 BASIS OF VALUATION

Valuation of assets should take into consideration of certain factors, which may individually or collectively influence the conclusion. The following factors, although not all-inclusive, are fundamental and required consideration in determining the fair value of the assets:

- Land & Land Development has been valued as per the IVS-500 Market approach.
- Building & Other Construction has been valued as per the IVS-500 Cost approach.
- Plant & Machinery valued as per the IVS-500 Cost approach.
- Fair value measurement approach as per accounting standard of IFRS 13.
- · The nature of the assets used by SRL.
- · The cost price of the assets of SRL.

In arriving at the fair value of assets of the company, the value has been assessed based on current market price, historical cost, and replacement cost.

6.00 METHODOLOGY

Rahman Mostafa Alam & Co. (RMA) has obtained both quantitative and qualitative information about the company. RMA has reviewed various statements and documents namely documents regarding the acquisition of Land such as Gazette, Khajna receipts. Wherever considered appropriate, based on the scrutiny of the information provided, due adjustments have been made and also estimated certain figures based on historical information in arriving at a valuation of assets of SRL as of March 31, 2022

To determine a methodology and base, we obtained the information together with other related documents of land, building, Plant & Machinery. All this information was analyzed and conducted physical verification of such assets; and discussed with the company's management to arrive at an acceptable methodology for verifying and valuing individual items of the company. The methodology applied for each category of assets is indicated below:

7.00 FAIR VALUE OF ASSETS

FIXED ASSETS

Fixed assets comprise Land & Land Development, Factory building, Klin Constraction, Plant & Machinery, Motor Vehicles, Furniture & Fixture, Equipment, Tundis Board. In valuing fixed assets, consideration has been made on the market value and cost, wherever appropriate, having regard to their uses in the company, and believe that the valuation, though judgmental in nature, closely approximates the real value of the assets under consideration.





7.01 Land & Land Development

The professional expert team physically examined the land and surrounding. In working out the fair value of the land, consideration has been made to give importance to the location and locality of the land in terms of commercial, residential, industrial, communication, and other related factors like current rate of local sub-register office and local traded value. The fair value of the land in the respective area has been applied to professional judgment. The fair value has been considered Tk. 162,000,000 against the Carrying value of Tk. 10,739,494. Details are given in Surveyor Report (Annexure-A).

7.02 Factory Building

In consideration of the fair value of the building's present condition, nature and maintenance have been examined. The fair value of Building and steel structure is assessed on professional judgment by considering the various related factors such as longevity of the building, year of construction, quality of building material used, present condition of the building and nature of maintenance. The fair value has been considered Tk. 5,729,512 as against the Carrying value of Tk. 7,090,091. Details are given in Surveyor Report (Annexure-B).

7.03. Klin Construction

In consideration of the fair value of the Klin Construction's present condition, nature and maintenance have been examined. The fair value of Klin Construction overhauling is assessed on professional judgment by considering the various related factors such as longevity of the Klin Construction, year of the major overhauling, present condition of the Klin Construction and nature of maintenance. The fair value has been considered Tk. 10,154,664 as against the Carrying value of Tk. 16,657,489. Details are given in Surveyor Report (Annexure-C).

7.04. Plant & Machinery

In consideration of the fair value of the Plant & Machinery's present condition, nature and maintenance have been examined. The fair value of plant & other overhauling is assessed on professional judgment by considering the various related factors such as longevity of the Plant & Machinery, year of the major overhauling, present condition of the Plant & Machinery and nature of maintenance. The fair value has been considered Tk. 8,515,659 as against the Carrying value of Tk. 8,880,036. Details are given in Surveyor Report (Annexure-D).





7.05. Motor Vehicles

In consideration of the fair value of the Motor Vehicles present condition, nature and maintenance have been examined. The fair value of Motor Vehicles overhauling is assessed on professional judgment by considering the various related factors such as longevity of the Motor Vehicles, year of the major overhauling, present condition of the Motor Vehicles and nature of maintenance. The fair value has been considered Tk. 459,236 as against the Carrying value of Tk. 138,476. Which is not allowed as stipulated vide Notification no. SEC/CMRRCD/2009-193/150/Admin/dated August 18, 2013 issued by Bangladesh Securities and Exchange Commission (BSEC). Instead, book value of the asset has been treated as present replacement cost. Details are given in Surveyor Report (Annexure-E).

7.06. Furniture & Fixture

In consideration of the fair value of the Furniture & Fixture's present condition, nature and maintenance have been examined. The fair value of Furniture & other overhauling is assessed on professional judgment by considering the various related factors such as longevity of the Furniture & Fixture, year of the major overhauling, present condition of the Furniture & Fixture and nature of maintenance. The fair value has been considered Tk. 151,292 as against the Carrying value of Tk. 567,570. Instead, book value of the asset has been treated as present replacement cost. Details are given in Surveyor Report (Annexure-F).

7.07. Equipment

In consideration of the fair value of the Equipment's present condition, nature and maintenance have been examined. The fair value of Equipment overhauling is assessed on professional judgment by considering the various related factors such as longevity of the Equipment, year of the major overhauling, present condition of the Equipment and nature of maintenance. The fair value has been considered Tk. 488,677 as against the Carrying value of Tk. 1,703,979. Details are given in Surveyor Report (Annexure-G).

7.08. Tundis Board

In consideration of the fair value of the Tundis Board's present condition, nature and maintenance have been examined. The fair value of Tundis Board overhauling is assessed on professional judgment by considering the various related factors such as longevity of the Tundis Board, year of the major overhauling, present condition of the Tundis Board and nature of maintenance. The fair value has been considered Tk. Nil. as against the Carrying value of Tk. 173,890.

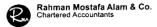
